

간결함 독특어법 (간결테크닉)

1. Concise noun phrases / modifier fronting (간결명사구 / 수식어 앞배치)

- Concise noun phrases (간결명사구)
 - 긴 구나 절을 짧은 명사구로 전환하는 간결 테크닉.
 - 대칭구문, 등 다른 스타일 요소에도 매우 요긴하게 쓰임.
- Modifier fronting (수식어 앞배치)
 - 명사 뒤의 긴 수식어를 축소해 앞으로 배치 → 긴 명사구를 짧고 간결한 명사구로
- Modifier fronting / **simple cases**: back modifier is a phrase ([→]: no verb)
 - skills in <u>management</u> → <u>management</u> skills
 - arrangements for <u>travel</u> → <u>travel</u> arrangements
 - day of grand opening → grand opening day
 - families with low income → low-income families
- Modifier fronting / complex cases: back modifier is a clause (절: with verb)
 - 뒤수식어 문법적 구조별로 정리

Grammatical structure of the clausal back modifier (뒤수식어 절 문법 구조)

- a. N that be AP (관계대명사 + be 동사 + 형용사구)
 - a **friend** who is <u>(very)</u> <u>nice</u> → a (very) nice **friend**
 - a worker who is <u>conscious</u> of <u>safety</u> → a safety-conscious worker
 - **crimes** that are <u>related</u> to <u>drugs</u> → drug-related **crimes**
- b. N that passive (관계대명사 + 수동태)
 - a **movement** that is <u>led</u> by <u>students</u> → a student-led **movement**
- c. N that active (관계대명사 + 능동태)
 - Intellectuals who <u>lead</u> the <u>world</u> → world-leading intellectuals (world-lead X)
- d. N to-infinitive (부정사)
 - efforts to <u>rescue</u> <u>dogs</u> → dog rescue efforts (dog-rescuing X)

Determiner (한정사)	M2 (modifier 2)	M1 (modifier 1)	N	Korean
a / the / my	very	nice	friend	아주 좋은 친구
a / the / my	safety	conscious	worker	안전에 주의하는 작업자
the / my	drug-	related	crimes	마약 관련 범죄
a / the / our	student-	led	movement	학생 주도 운동
the / our	world-	leading	intellectuals	세계를 이끄는 지식인
the / our	dog	rescue	efforts	개 구조 노력

Use of hyphens

- Basic rules
 - 주로 뒤에 붙는 수식어가 앞으로 배치될 때 앞수식어임을 분명히 해주기 위해 사용.
 - 원래 앞에 주로 쓰이는 수식어: no hyphen (very good friend)
 - 한정사 (the, a, my): no hyphen
- Conventional practice
 - M1 = 과거분사/현재분사: strongly preferred (drug-<u>related</u>, student-<u>led</u>, world-<u>leading</u>)
 - Long (more than 2 words): strongly preferred (<u>5-year-old</u> machine)
- Get help
 - Search: Google, etc.
 - Grammar checker: Paperpal, Grammarly

1a. N that be AP (형용사구)

- Basic cases
 - a worker who is <u>conscious</u> of <u>safety</u> → a safety-conscious worker
 - a **research center** that is <u>based</u> in <u>Washington</u> → a Washington-based **research center**
 - landscape that is <u>pleasing</u> to the <u>eyes</u> → eye-pleasing landscape
 - a **memory** that was <u>forgotten</u> for a <u>long</u> time → a long-forgotten **memory**
 - a **storm** that is as <u>long</u> as <u>2 weeks</u> → a 2-week-long **storm**
 - a machine that is <u>5 yeas old</u> → a 5-year-old machine
- worthy / worth
 - a **legal system** that is <u>worthy</u> of <u>respect</u> → a respect-worthy **legal system**
 - a model that is <u>worth</u> <u>copying</u> → a copy-worthy model (copying-worth X)
- Number: 앞수식어의 명사는 단수로
 - **crimes** that are <u>related</u> to <u>drugs</u> → <u>drug</u>-related **crimes** (drugs-related X)
 - a player who is <u>seven feet tall</u> → a seven-<u>foot</u>-tall player (seven-feet-tall X)

1a. N that be AP (형용사구)

- Non-basic structure: move "a" back when M2 = too, so, as, that
 - a stick that is \underline{too} long \rightarrow a too long stick X / too long \underline{a} stick O
 - a **problem** that is so big \rightarrow so big a **problem**
 - a person who is that great → that great a person
- Non-basic structure: comparative with "than"
 - a **result** that is better than expected → a better-than-expected **result** (CNN)
 - Every normal and thinking-capable human being can learn ... (The Buddhist Deception)
 - ... his use of Hume's philosophy is too self-conscious to permit so easy a solution ...
 (Journal of the History of Philosophy)
 - > Still, a larger-than-life poster of Mr. Hussein just beyond the entrance remained relatively unscathed. (New York Times)

1b. N that passive (수동태)

• Treatment of the actor (행위자 처리)

Actor = noun: same as "that be AP"

- **Movement** that is <u>led</u> by <u>students</u> → student-led **movement** (students-led X)
- **Town** that is <u>controlled</u> by <u>Kurds</u> → Kurd-controlled **town** (NYT)

<u>Actor = pronoun: 소유격으로</u>

- **recipes** that is <u>chosen</u> by $\underline{me} \rightarrow \underline{my}$ chosen **recipes** (\underline{me} chosen recipes X)
- a subject that I hate (= <u>hated</u> by <u>me</u>) → <u>my</u> hated subject (my <u>hating</u> X)
- money she earned through hard work → her hard-earned money
 - = **money** <u>earned</u> by <u>her</u> through <u>hard</u> work
- Treatment of the beneficiary (수혜자 처리): 소유격으로
 - **books** <u>recommended</u> for <u>children</u> → <u>children</u>'s recommended **books** (children recommended X)
 - areas <u>designated</u> for <u>smokers</u> → <u>smokers</u> designated areas

1b. N that passive (수동태)

- Form variation: 중요도에 따라 취사선택
 - movement that is <u>led</u> by <u>students</u> → student-led movement → student movement
 - repair performed on the site → site-performed repair / site repair / on-site repair
 - magazine provided in the <u>flight</u> → flight-provided magazine / flight magazine / <u>in-flight magazine</u>
 - words given by her when she was dying → her dying words

대칭구문 >

It's my closest friend and my most hated enemy. [procrastination] (Journal of Student Success in Writing)

수식위치

Protect your hard-earned money and invest for the future. (MOAA)

- ... cost-effectiveness of **on-site** evaluation of fine-needle aspiration specimens (*Diagnostic cytopathology*)
- Ironically, she faces a horribly violent death, yet her dying words reveal a much different attitude toward God and her killer (A Journal of the Oxford Round Table)

1c. N that active (능동태)

- Verb = transitive (타동사)
 - a device that <u>saves</u> time → a time-saving device
 - intellectuals who <u>lead</u> the <u>world</u> → world-leading intellectuals
 - **demonstrators** who are <u>throwing rocks</u> \rightarrow rock-throwing **demonstrators** (rocks-throwing X)
 - **people** who are <u>learning</u> <u>languages</u> → language-learning **people** → language **learners**
- Verb = intransitive (자동사)
 - people who work hard → hard working people
 - a man who <u>looks</u> <u>strange</u> → a strange-looking man

1d. N to-infinitive (부정사)


- To-inf (to 부정사)
 - **skills** to <u>solve</u> <u>problems</u> → problem-solving **skills**
 - **efforts** to <u>rescue</u> <u>dogs</u> → dog rescue **efforts**
 - efforts to <u>rescue</u> <u>people</u> → rescue efforts
 - exam to make up for missing the original exam → make-up exam



"rescue efforts"
"rescuing efforts"

- Prep-ing (전치사 + 동명사)
 - process of making a decision → decision-making process
 - Hypocrisy, double standards, and "but nots" are the price of universalist pretensions. (The Clash of Civilizations)



pretensions to being a universalist→ universalist pretensions

 - → ... his departing words ... (Through a Looking Glass)

- 5. At CES, carmakers are expected to show off the latest improvements to self-driving tech, like smarter parking assistance and **collision avoidance that is less prone to errors**.
 - → ... <u>smarter</u> parking assistance and <u>less error-prone</u> collision avoidance. (*New York Times*)
- 6. His work demonstrates his keen ability to identify **links that are essential and worth exploring** between the natural sciences, the humanistic disciplines, and cultural history.
 - → ... essential and explore-worthy links ... (The Helmholtz Legacy in Physiological Acoustics)
- 7. ChatGPT sometimes writes answers that sound plausible but are incorrect or nonsensical.
 - → ... plausible-sounding but incorrect or nonsensical answers. (IEEE Annals of the History of Computing)

- 10. Their **capability to speak two languages** and **flexibility with two cultures** offer the transnational entrepreneurs a comparative advantage in bilateral business.
 - → ... bilingual capability ... bicultural flexibility ... (A study of Cross-cultural Capabilities for Chinese Transnational Entrepreneurs)
